WELCOME TO THE COLLABORATIVE DESIGN OF PORTO YOUTH STRATEGY 4.0

Young people and youth organisations have inspired the innovation of Porto youth policies over the past 20 years. In 2000, a youth-led movement challenged the Municipality of Porto to create Porto Youth Council. In 2009, Porto developed its first Municipal Youth Plan, a decisive contribution for the recognition of local youth policies in Portugal. Porto Municipal Youth Plan 2.0 [2011] and 3.0 [2017] continued to explore possibilities to enforce youth rights, develop strategic planning, enhance youth participatory, ensure cross-sectorial collaboration and support knowledge-based and evidence-based youth policies.

In 2020, Porto has a dynamic youth ecosystem, including more than 100 member-organizations in Porto Youth Council. The Municipal Youth Division runs an annual budget of €197,200 and develops trademark projects such as «Debate Your City», «Capacita.te» or «Porto Acolhe». The municipal support fund for local organisations will dedicate €100,000 to youth organizations. The city has youth-friendly infrastructures, such as the House of Youth Organisations [«Casa das Associações»], the Portuguese Youth Information Centre, «Polo Zero», «Loja Ponto JA» and Porto Youth Hostel. The 20th anniversary of Porto Youth Council, the 200th anniversary of the Liberal Revolution and the Decade of Action for Sustainable Development Goals combine in 2020, to inspire a unique opportunity to develop a new youth strategy.

The process of designing Porto Youth Strategy 4.0 recognizes young people as full citizens, rights-holders, agents of positive change and equal partners. It invites and challenges all young people and youth organizations in Porto to build a shared, ambitious and futuristic vision, Porto Youth Goals and a toolbox to support action and quality development.

The Municipality of Porto recognizes youth as an opportunity and we wish to seize this endeavour to explore new possibilities and push boundaries, collaborate and support mutual learning and peer learning, develop competences, build trust and link local, national and european youth policies to «engage, connect and empower» young people.

We are going to build an attractive, clear, goal-oriented, practical and simple tool that the diversity of young people and youth organisations in Porto can understand and use to amplify youth participation.

Above all, we are going to discover the perceptions young people have for the present and future of the city and how can we transform the city with the vision and action of young people.

We want to make an ambitious journey, because Porto is ambitious; and because ambition is paramount to attract young people and respond to their needs and aspirations.

It is with a balance of ambition, experience and responsibility that the Municipality of Porto seeks to renew its commitment to young people and youth organizations. We wish to work with them to continue developing a sustainable youth-friendly city.

KEYS TO SUCCESS OF YOUTH POLICY

«A clearly defined government authority on youth, a body that can lead, direct, coordinate and consolidate the work.

A clearly defined intended beneficiary group of young people, for example a definition of age limits and/or of the groups that the policy intervention aims to reach.

A concrete and transparent strategy and an action plan, and mechanisms of monitoring and evaluation, to keep policy makers accountable and to learn in order to improve youth policy.

A knowledge base, for example a mapping of the different needs of different young people, research and statistics, and empirical information from policy implementation.

A vision considering young people as a resource, not as a problem, to support and empower young people to develop their full potential and to contribute positively to society.

A belief in the value of and a capacity to enable meaningful youth participation, i.e. young people participating in policy processes and being engaged in youth organisations and community life.

A cross-sectoral approach to youth policy, bringing together different sectors of public policies that have a role to play in the lives of young people, from the "youth field" and beyond.

A separate sustainable budget, because policy needs to be backed by sustainable, dedicated, adequate resources for implementation.

Established links between local, regional and national levels, recognising the competences and responsibilities of all actors and seeking cooperation, co-ordination and partnership.

#6 WHAT IS YOUTH DIALOGUE?

Youth Dialogue is a constructive dialogue and collaboration mechanism that brings together young people, policy makers and experts in the field of youth to improve or design new youth policies.

With Erasmus+ #YouthUpPorto Youth Dialogue, the Municipality of Porto sets up a local youth dialogue for Porto Youth Strategy 4.0 collaborative design. Throughout 9 participatory labs, 270 participants, including 180 young people and 90 policy makers and experts in the field of youth, will explore solutions to «engage, connect and empower» youth.

All activities will be organized in safe, inclusive and accessible spaces; using non-formal learning to support mutual and peer learning.






